## 6. GENERAL CONDITIONS ENZOOTIC DISEASES REGULATIONS

Banteng, blackbut, buffalo, deer, feral goats, feral donkeys and feral pigs may only enter the State if a **Permit to Introduce Declared Animals** has been issued by Department of Agriculture and Food, Forrestfield, telephone: (08) 9366 2300, facsimile: (08) 9453 1288 and consignment is to a person who holds a relevant **Permit to Keep Declared Animals**.

**Prior notification of movement:** In the case of transport by land or sea, whichever of the owner, another person or transport company is transporting the animals must notify the inspector at the contact point appropriate to the route of entry at least three days before the estimated time of arrival. In the case of transport by air, the airline company is to notify the South Perth office of the Department of Agriculture and Food immediately it has confirmed its contract to transport the animals.

**Notification** of not less than 3 days before the expected date and time of arrival shall be given of the expected date and time of arrival of the stock to an inspector at the Entry Inspection Post through which the stock are to be moved into the State.

**Certification:** The original form *Movement of Stock to Western Australia* (AD1071) is to accompany the stock, a copy of the duplicate is to be forwarded by fax or post to the appropriate office of the Department of Agriculture and Food Western Australia as shown above. If sending the copy by post, allow sufficient time for the document to reach the destination before arrival of the stock.

**Inspection:** The stock must be inspected by a Registered Veterinary Surgeon or Authorised Inspector of Stock not more than 14 days prior to commencement of direct movement to Western Australia and during that period must be isolated from stock of lesser health status. The stock must meet the requirements included in the declaration by the owner, the declaration by the owner/manager of the property of origin and the additional requirements below. Stock will be inspected again at the point of entry into Western Australia. Stock with wool or hair length in excess of 20 mm or otherwise unable to be certified free from Declared Plants may be ordered to be, at the owner's expense, shorn, cleansed; forwarded on for slaughter only, or returned to the State of origin.

**Identification:** Stock shall not be moved into Western Australia unless they are each identified to their property of origin by means of a legible/readable brand, ear tag, tattoo, or some other approved identification. Breeding stock must be individually identified. Cattle and buffalo must be tagged with an NLIS device unless moving directly to a live export depot from their property of birth in which case they must be identified with an ear tag bearing the PIC of the property of birth, or an NLIS device.

**Transport** of the stock from the place of inspection to Western Australia may be by road, air, sea or rail transport, but not by droving on foot.

**Fees:** An inspection fee will be charged for each **consignment** of stock arriving in Western Australia. The costs of any tests or treatments, fodder and tending, yarding and holding of the stock will be the responsibility of the owner or agent of the owner of the stock as the case may be.

**WARNING:** At any time after entering Western Australia, imported stock, and stock with which they may have had contact, and land on which they may have run, may be deemed as being suspected of being diseased, if any stock or land with which the imported stock may have had contact prior to entry is found to be diseased.

## 7. DEFINITIONS

**Liver Fluke Restricted Area:** The cities, shires and localities of Albany, Armadale, Augusta-Margaret River, Bridgetown-Greenbushes, Bunbury, Busselton, Capel, Chittering, Collie, Dandaragan, Dardanup, Denmark, Donnybrook-Balingup, Esperance, Gingin, Harvey, Jerramungup, Kalamunda, Mandurah, Manjimup, Mundaring, Murray, Nannup, Northam, Perth Metropolitan Area, Ravensthorpe, Rockingham, Serpentine-Jarrahdale, Swan, Toodyay, Wanneroo, Waroona.

**Liver Fluke Test Exempt Area:** Northern Territory and Queensland, north and west of the line of the road which runs from Hungerford to Thargomindah to Quilpie to Adavale to Blackall to Jericho to Alpha to Clermont to Mount Douglas on the Gregory Development Road, to Bowen via Collinsville on the Bowen Development Road and South Australia, north of Highway 32 from New South Wales border to Peterborough, Highway 83 from Peterborough to Carrieton, and north of the boundaries of the Counties of Dalhousie and Frome from Carrieton to Port Augusta, and those areas of Eyre Peninsula north of County Flinders.

A **Declaration** made by the owner that the animals were born and have grazed only in the **Liver Fluke Test Exempt Area** or the **Bovine Johne's Disease Protected Zone** of South Australia, the Northern Territory or Queensland, or **Re-entry of Stock**.

**Cattle Tick Infected Area:** The Kimberley excluding Balgo (Ngulubi), Billiluna, Lake Gregory and Wallal stations.

**Kimberley:** The local government districts of Broome, Halls Creek, West Kimberley and Wyndham-East Kimberley.

**Pastoral Area:** The local government districts of Ashburton, Carnarvon, Coolgardie, Cue, Dundas, East Pilbara, Exmouth, Laverton, Leonora, Kalgoorlie-Boulder, Meekatharra, Menzies, Mount Magnet, Murchison, Ngaanyatjarraku, Port Hedland, Roebourne, Sandstone, Shark Bay, Upper Gascoyne, Wiluna and Yalgoo.

**Fluke Egg Sedimentation Test (FEST)** must be carried out by an approved laboratory on individual animal samples of at least 4 grams of faeces (sheep, goats, alpacas) and 10 grams of faeces (horses, cattle, large camelids) to determine the presence of or freedom from liver fluke eggs.

**Liver fluke treatment** dose rates for Western Australia under APVMA Permit No.6898 are triclabendazole at 15 mg/kg (ruminants and camelids) and 12 mg/kg (equines).

**Liver fluke treatment withholding periods** (Note: APVMA Permit No. 6898 treatment dose rates and withholding periods override label conditions.)

**SINGLE TREATMENT:** Do not slaughter less than 28 days after treatment.

**MULTIPLE TREATMENTS:** Do not slaughter less than 42 days after last treatment.

**CAMELIDS:** Do not slaughter less than 49 days after treatment.

**MILK:** Where an animal gives birth within 35 days after treatment or an animal is lactating at the time of treatment, milk for human consumption must not be collected from that animal until 35 days after the last treatment.

**CALVES:** Do not slaughter calves fed milk from treated animal/s less than 28 days after last exposure.

**EXPORT SLAUGHTER INTERVAL:** Not less than 6 months from final treatment.

A **consignment** is one or more animals from a separate property of origin or going to a separate destination property.

**Stock**, for the purpose of these conditions of movement, means any buffalo, camel, camelid (camelids refer to South American camelids and include alpaca, llama, guanaco and vicuna), cattle, deer, equine, goat pig or sheep.

## 8. HEALTH STATUS, TREATMENT AND TESTING

### (a) Brucellosis – Pigs

Pigs from the Northern Territory north of the Tropic of Capricorn or from Queensland must either be from a herd accredited free of *Brucella suis*, or be from a herd in which *Brucella suis* is not known to exist and be subjected to a Serum Agglutination Test (SAT) for *Brucella suis* with negative results within 30 days prior to movement.

### (b) Cattle tick

- (i) Stock being moved to any area other than the **Cattle Tick Infected Area** must be inspected and certified free of cattle tick prior to movement by an authorised person.
- (ii) Cattle and buffalo being moved from an area other than a Cattle Tick Free Area must have an approved treatment for tick followed within 3 to 7 days by a clean inspection and a supervised treatment immediately prior to movement unless moving from a property in the Northern Territory not under movement restrictions due to chemical resistant tick to the **Cattle Tick Infected Area** in Western Australia.

### (c) Enzootic bovine leucosis – Dairy cattle

Dairy cattle must originate from a herd of Bulk Milk Test Negative status, or higher, under the National Guidelines for Control and Eradication of Enzootic Bovine Leucosis in Dairy Cattle.

### (d) Footrot – Sheep and goats

- (i) Sheep and goats must not have been foot bathed or received antibiotics for any purpose within 3 months prior to movement; **and**
- (ii) Sheep and goats must not have been vaccinated for footrot within 12 months prior to movement; **and**
- (iii) Sheep and goats must have been born on the property of origin or have been on the property of origin for not less than 12 months prior to movement, except for temporary removal to an agricultural show where precautions against the spread of footrot were taken; **and**
- (iv) Sheep and goats must not have had any known contact with sheep or goats affected with footrot within 12 months prior to movement;
- (v) Sheep and goats must have had all feet individually inspected by a Registered Veterinary Surgeon or an Authorised Inspector of Stock within 14 days prior to movement, and have shown no evidence of virulent footrot; **and**
- (vi) Sheep and goats must not have been present on a property where the sheep or goats have been suspected or known to be infected with virulent footrot during the two years prior to the date of movement. Where any animals have shown signs of interdigital dermatitis or any form of footrot during this two-year period, the State animal health authorities have tested samples taken from those lesions and reported that all *Dichelobacter nodosus* isolates obtained from culture of those samples were classified as 'unstable' by the protease thermostability (gelatin gel) test.

### (e) Johne's disease – Camels, camelids and ruminants

- (i) **An eligible property** is one on which there have not been, within the last 24 months, any Bovine Johne's disease (BJD) high prevalence categories of animals or animals suspected or known to be infected with BJD. High prevalence categories are those for which the Zone prevalence for that category exceeds 10%. As at October 2004, BJD high prevalence categories are dairy cattle in the Control Zone of NSW or Victoria.
- (ii) **All stock** being moved must, for the 24 months immediately prior to the movement, have grazed only on eligible properties (see (i) above) or had access only to feed from such properties.
- (iii) **Alpaca**
  - (i) Alpaca from the **BJD Protected Zone** of Queensland must:
    - a. be accompanied by a declaration signed by the owner that the animals were born in and have grazed only in the **BJD Protected Zone** of Queensland; and have grazed only with alpaca that meet these conditions;

**OR**

- b. be from a herd in the Alpaca Market Assurance Program (AlpacaMAP); **OR**
  - c. be from a herd in the *Q-Alpaca* biosecurity program that has been eligible for equivalence with MN1 in the AlpacaMAP for at least 6 months prior to movement.
- (ii) Alpaca from a **BJD Zone other than Queensland** must:
- a. be from a herd in the Alpaca Market Assurance Program (AlpacaMAP); **OR**
  - b. be from a herd in the *Q-Alpaca* biosecurity program that has been eligible for or has equivalence with MN1 in the AlpacaMAP for at least 6 months prior to movement.
- (iv) **Beef cattle**
- (i) Beef cattle from the **BJD Protected Zones** of the Northern Territory (NT), Queensland (Qld) or South Australia (SA) must:
- a. be accompanied by a declaration signed by the owner that the animals were born in, and have grazed only in, a BJD Protected Zone in the NT, Qld or SA; and have grazed only with cattle that meet these conditions; **OR**
  - b. if not accompanied by such a declaration, meet the conditions of movement applying to cattle from a BJD Protected Zone other than in the NT, Qld or SA.
- (ii) Beef cattle from a **BJD Protected Zone** other than in the NT, QLD or SA must:
- a. have a Cattle Market Assurance Program (CattleMAP) status of MN2 or MN3; **OR**
  - b. be from a herd that has had a negative Check Test (see section xi) within 12 months prior to movement and had no subsequent contact with cattle of a lower BJD status.
- (iii) Beef cattle from a **Control Zone** or a **Residual Zone** must have a CattleMAP status of MN3.
- (v) **Camels (Dromedary and Bactrian)**
- (i) Camels from **BJD Protected Zones** in the NT, Qld, or SA must:
- a. be accompanied by a declaration signed by the owner that the camels were born in, and have grazed only in a **BJD Protected Zone** of the NT, Qld, or SA; and have grazed only with camels that meet these conditions; **OR**
  - b. if not accompanied by such a declaration, meet the conditions of movement applying to camels from a **BJD Protected Zone** other than in the NT, Qld, or SA.
- (ii) Camels from **BJD Zones** other than the **BJD Protected Zone** in the NT, Qld, or SA must:
- a. have had, or if less than two years of age, the dam of the animals must have had, a negative faecal culture test for BJD, with the results being obtained within 30 days prior to movement; **OR**
  - b. be from a herd that has within 12 months prior to movement, had a negative Check Test using the faecal culture test for BJD and no subsequent contact with camels of a lower BJD status.
- (vi) **Camelids other than Camels and Alpaca** must:
- a. have had, or if less than two years of age, the dam of the animals must have had, a negative faecal culture test for BJD, with the results being obtained within 30 days prior to movement; **OR**
  - b. be from a herd that has, within 12 months prior to movement, had a negative Check Test (see section xi) and no subsequent contact with camelids of a lower BJD status.
- (vii) **Dairy cattle**  
Dairy cattle must have a CattleMap status of MN3.
- (viii) **Deer** must:
- a. have had, or if less than two years of age, the dam of the animals must have had, a negative faecal culture test for BJD with the results being obtained within 30 days prior to movement; **OR**
  - b. be from a herd that has, within 12 months prior to movement, had a negative Check Test (see section xi) and had no subsequent contact with deer of a lower BJD status.
- (ix) **Goats**
- (i) Goats from a **BJD Protected Zone** must:
- a. have a Goat Market Assurance Program (GoatMAP) status of MN2 or MN3; **OR**
  - b. be from a herd that has, within 12 months prior to movement, had a negative Check Test (see section xi) and had no subsequent contact with goats of a lower BJD status.
- (ii) Goats from a **BJD Control Zone** or a **BJD Residual Zone** must have a GoatMAP status of MN3.
- (x) **Sheep**  
**Sheep** must have 1 or more points under the Assurance Based Credit (ABC) Scheme of the National Management of Ovine Johne's Disease Plan (2007-2012).
- (xi) **The Check Test** for cattle is an ELISA test, for goats an ELISA or AGID test or pooled faecal culture, and for alpaca, camelids and deer is a faecal culture test. Sampling for Check Testing is per the NJDP Standard Definitions and Rules for cattle, goats, deer and camelids with cattle strains of *M. paratuberculosis*.
- (xii) **Other species** may be permitted entry upon **application to the Inspector in Charge (Stock)**. The test for these species is a faecal culture test.

**(f) Liver fluke – Ruminants, camelids and equines**

- (i) Livestock, other than pigs, being moved for **slaughter** must be moved direct to lairage for slaughter within 48 hours if the abattoir is in the **Liver Fluke Restricted Area**. Those being moved for slaughter in abattoirs in other areas must be moved direct to lairage or to approved holding yards for slaughter within 14 days. No treatment or testing is required.
- (ii) Livestock, other than pigs, being moved to the ports of Broome or Wyndham for immediate **export** overseas, must be **treated for liver fluke** under the supervision of a Registered Veterinary Surgeon or authorised Inspector of Stock between 14 and 28 days prior to movement, unless accompanied by a **Declaration**.
- (iii) Livestock, other than pigs, that are not being moved for slaughter or immediate live export from Broome or Wyndham, must be individually tested by the **Fluke Egg Sedimentation Test (FEST)** for liver fluke with negative results within 14 days prior to movement. Faecal samples for the test must be taken by a Registered Veterinary Surgeon or authorised Inspector of Stock no sooner than 14 days after the most recent liver fluke treatment. In consignments of more than 30 animals with the same grazing history, only 30 animals selected at random need be individually tested. The test must be negative. If one animal in a consignment with the same grazing history returns a positive test, the entire consignment is considered to be positive and must be treated and retested at least 14 days after treatment and return a negative test result. All animals in the consignment will be **treated for liver fluke** under the supervision of a Registered Veterinary Surgeon or authorised Inspector of Stock at the Entry Inspection Post.

Animals originating from the Liver Fluke Test Exempt Area and accompanied by a Declaration do not require a negative **Fluke Egg Sedimentation Test (FEST)** prior to entry when consigned to any destination in Western Australia but are still required to be **treated for liver fluke** under the supervision of a Registered Veterinary Surgeon or authorised Inspector of Stock at the Entry Inspection Post. Additionally, animals originating from the Liver Fluke Test Exempt Area and accompanied by a Declaration and which are consigned to the Kimberley region are not required to be treated for liver fluke at the Entry Inspection Post or have a negative Fluke Egg Sedimentation Test (FEST) prior to entry.

- (iv) Livestock, other than pigs, being moved to the **Pastoral Area**, may, in lieu of the timetable in (iii) above, be **treated for liver fluke** under the supervision of a Registered Veterinary Surgeon or authorised Inspector of Stock between 21 and 35 days prior to movement and, at the time of treatment, be sampled for testing by the **Fluke Egg Sedimentation Test (FEST)** and, from the time of treatment and sampling for FEST until moved to Western Australia, they are held on an area considered by a Registered Veterinary Surgeon or authorised Inspector of Stock to be an unsuitable habitat for the liver fluke intermediate host snail and have access only to feed from this or other such area or to pelleted feed. Each animal in the consignment must be treated again with triclabendazole at 15 mg/kg within 48 hours prior to embarkation for Western Australia or at the Entry Inspection Post in Western Australia. The timing of the two treatments should be at least 21 days apart, with the second treatment being no more than 48 hours prior to commencing transport to Western Australia, or at the Entry Inspection Post (Kununurra).
- (v) **Performance horses** entering Western Australia for not more than 28 days for the sole purpose of performance competition may be exempt from testing and treatment following a written application for exemption by the owner (see Application Form IM997A) and if they meet all the following criteria:
  - a. The owner provides a declaration in writing or evidence that the horses are entering the State for the sole purpose of performance competition.
  - b. The duration of the stay is no more than 28 days.
  - c. The **property of destination** has been **approved** in writing by an Inspector who found the property to be free from habitat suitable for the vector snail of liver fluke and to have facilities for the stabling and exercise of the horse(s). The Inspector in Charge (Stock) in Western Australia on (08) 9368 3370 will issue the owner with an Approval Notice.
  - d. The horse(s) will be under movement restrictions imposed under a Quarantine Order.
  - e. In the **Liver Fluke Restricted Area** all faeces from untreated horses are collected from within the approved facilities and rendered sterile by composting for 14 days or by burning.
  - f. The horse(s) is/are not to leave the approved property unless the owner/manager has received and is in possession of a Permit to Move issued by an inspector to move the horse(s) off the property to another approved place of quarantine, being the place shown in the Permit to Move.
  - g. Any proposed extension of stay beyond 28 days is approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock in Western Australia. An application for extension must be made prior to the expiry of the permitted 28 days.
  - h. Horses remain in quarantine until they leave the State.

**(g) Tuberculosis – Cattle and buffalo**

Cattle and buffalo from herds of SU, IN, RD, PC and CF1 status under the National Tuberculosis Freedom Assurance Program may only be introduced for immediate slaughter or direct to the port of **Wyndham** for immediate export overseas and the owner must have the prior approval of the Chief Inspector of Stock.
